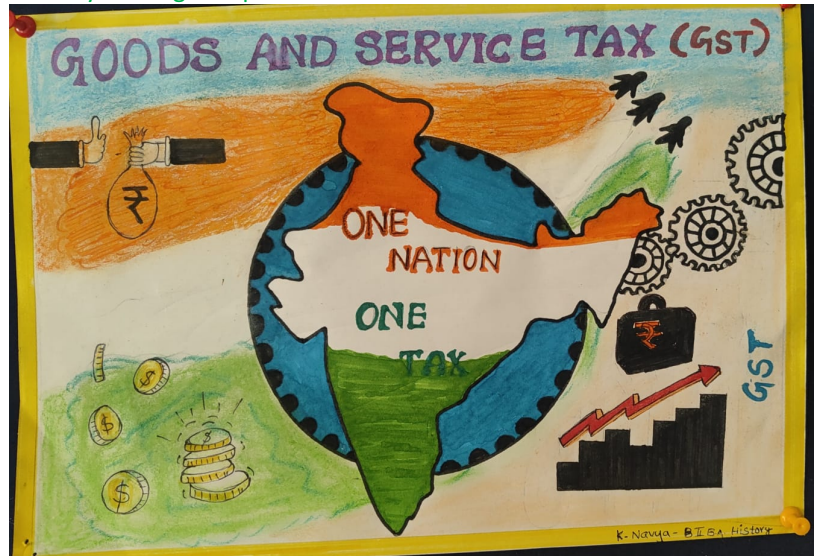
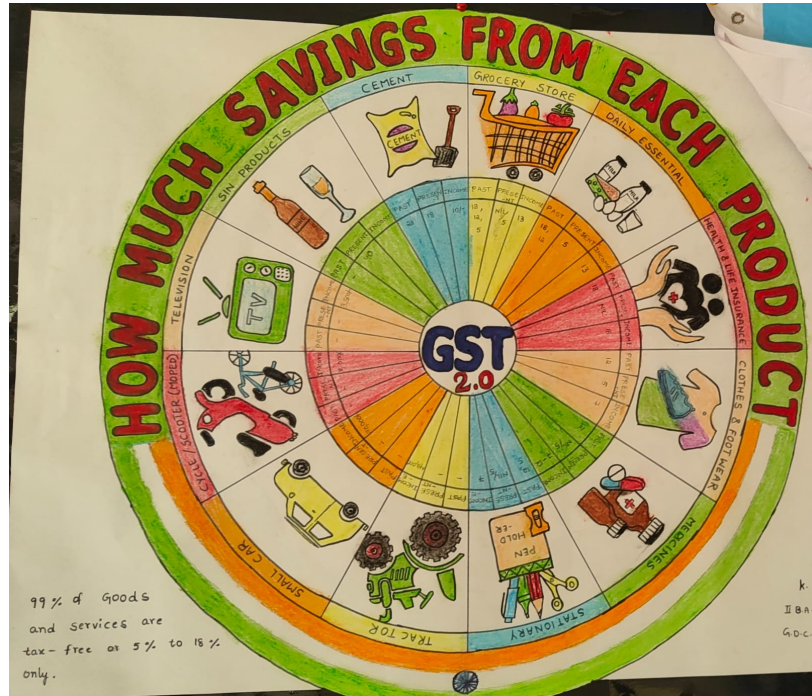


Super GST – Super Savings Month Celebrations
